Current Sermon Series Sinning Like a Christian: A new look at the 7 Deadly Sins

People may say that Christians are too

judgmental, that we talk too much about sin, but it seems that the problem really is that we talk too much about other people's sins - pointing out the proverbial speck in others' eyes while ignoring the logs in our own. We all know that we fall short of God's ideals for us, but too often prefer not to dwell on the specifics of our own sinfulness. During this sermon series we will dwell on our own shortcomings and find God's compassion waiting.

One of the most valuable aspects of music is the moments when there is the silence. Claude Debussy, the famous 20th century composer, recognized this when he said that "Music is the space between the notes." (*Turning Numbers into Knowledge: Mastering the Art of Problem Solving* (2001) by Jonathan G. Koomey, p.96.) Why make sound at all if silence is so important? It isn't about silence being the most important. It isn't about sound being the most important. It is about the integral balance between the two.

Understanding the balance of silence and sound makes it possible to embrace a wide world of musical styles that offer praise to God. So that keeps us from thinking that "our" way is the right way. All ways that embody a right relationship to God's teachings are the right way. God created hefty content with great style, so He is fully aware of what it takes to make something that is "tov", the Hebrew word that He used in Genesis when he declared creation "good". What it takes is to fulfill the function for which we were created by God, not the man interpreted version of that function, but the function for which God created each of us individually. This is to live in right relationship with God, our silences and our sounds in perfect balance with those God created us to make.

So, why are we confused about it when it comes to music? Perhaps that is because worship has been often misappropriated by popular culture, not just in our decade or the immediately preceding ones, but for centuries. Controlling the balances of silence and sound is something any architect or composer or theologian could tell you were essential to control over what people are expected to produce as a worshipful attitude toward God. This is because music and the arts can function as our emotional response to God. So, in my lifetime I have been told everything from if I didn't behave effusively, waving my hands in the air and shouting in church, then I didn't understand the joy of the Presence of God being told that to exude pleasure and joy in God's Presence was unseemly. That isn't what the musical praise of God is all about. That's what those particular individual's personal attempt to bring me into alignment with their brand of piety is about. I'm more interested in what God has to say on the subject, particularly on the subject of music and the arts as a means of worship. In the bible, God tells us both the silence and the sound have a place in God's Presence.

One of the loveliest aspects of choir and music in church is to enable people to offer up their praise to God, the praise that comes from their hearts in their words and it is one of the essential goals of choir to cover lots and lots of different types of music to see what new or old way those styles have to offer us in terms of worshiping God. I want to compliment Fields Chapel for its open embracing of singing everything from Harry Belafonte and Bill Withers to Gregorian chant and learning to embrace the silence and the sound balance in all forms.

Truthfully, there is no blank space in worship or in music. This was, after all, Claude Debussy's point. The blank space is the spot where the Spirit moves in to allow us to understand the sound.
